In RE, we have been learning about various

versions of the Nativity story. We compared and contrasted traditional and modern video interpretations of the Nativity. We were encouraged to use religious vocabulary such as 'Son of God', 'sacred' and 'holy' to express how special the birth of Jesus was. Using a modern video, we created a story strip of the moment when Angel Gabriel tells Mary that she is going to have a baby named Jesus/Son of God. We analysed biblical quotations from this and unpacked their meaning. For example, 'Greetings, you who are highly favoured!' This means that Mary was specially chosen by God.

In art, we have been drawing and painting Christmas scenes using watercolours and we even got to sit where we want! We all got given two sheets of paper to help us. We viewed a tutorial about how to use watercolours and use different techniques such as: wet on wet/wet on dry and blotting.




